#### Thurgood Marshall and the NAACP

This compelling documentary incorporates rare archival film and extraordinary interviews to chart Thurgood Marshall's life (1908-1993) in the years leading up to the landmark *Brown v. Board of Education* Supreme Court ruling. The documentary explores his upbringing in Baltimore, his education at Howard University Law School, his status as a rising star within the NAACP, his skill as an orator and storyteller, his relationship with his mentor Charles H. Houston, and his high-profile segregation cases.
